

Elder returns to majors, stops Marlins; their gaffe on the bases helps Braves

ATLANTA — Travis d'Arnaud continued his power binge with another home run, and Bryce Elder returned from the minor leagues to throw 6⅓ scoreless innings and help Atlanta beat the Marlins 3-0 on Monday night.

The Braves won for the seventh time in eight games, and they improved to 3-1 against the Marlins this season. Miami has alternated wins and losses through the past five games.

D'Arnaud homered for the fifth time in his past three starts, with his two-run blast in the fourth inning opening the scoring.

Elder, an All-Star last year who started the season with Triple A Gwinnett, was recalled Monday for his first-major league appearance of the season. He scattered eight hits, did not walk a batter and struck out four.

Miami starter Ryan Weathers (2-2) pitched 5⅓ innings and allowed three

runs on six hits and three walks with one strikeout.

A baserunning blunder cost the Marlins a run in the first inning. Luis Arraez failed to score from second base on a double by Jazz Chisholm Jr. off the wall in right-center. Arraez was thrown out at the plate by center fielder Michael Harris II.

MLB.com wrote that Arraez received a stop sign from third-base coach Griffin Benedict while rounding third, but trail runner Bryan De La Cruz wasn't paying attention

and was already approaching third. With Chisholm at second, Arraez was forced to go home.

Marlins manager Skip Schumaker told reporters that with no outs and runners on first and second, Arraez did what he was supposed to: be close enough to tag up at second to get to third on a ball that would have been a home run in many ballparks.

If De La Cruz had been aware that Benedict was holding Arraez, the Marlins could have had the

bases loaded with none out. Instead, Josh Bell and Jesus Sanchez fled out to end the inning.

The Braves scored all three runs in the fourth inning. Marcell Ozuna walked and d'Arnaud pulled a changeup that hit the foul pole in left field. Adam Duvall walked, took second on Harris' groundout and scored on David Fletcher's single. It was Fletcher's hit since joining the Braves on April 16.

Atlanta's Ronald Acuna Jr. singled and stole second base in the first inning. The steal was the 190th of his career, setting an Atlanta-era franchise record.

Elder was 12-4 in 2023 with a 3.81 ERA, but his performance dipped in the latter part of the season. He was sent to the minors last month after a rough spring training — he gave up 11 earned runs and 15 hits in 12 innings for an ERA of 8.25

Struggling Rays closer Fairbanks on IL with numb fingers

The Tampa Bay Rays put struggling closer **Pete Fairbanks** — who has had numbness in his fingers — on the 15-day injured list.

Fairbanks has experienced numbness in his fingers at times over the past few years, and the problem flared up again over the weekend, the Associated Press reported.

"Felt like he had a little bit of a zinger in his hand

just playing catch," manager **Kevin Cash** said.

Fairbanks has had tests on his right shoulder and arm, with additional testing to be done.

Fairbanks, 30, is 0-2 this season with a 9.00 ERA in eight games. He has three saves and one blown save.

Cash will consider several relievers to close games depending on the situation.

• **Orioles:** Baltimore on Tuesday was expected to

call up slugger **Heston Kjerstad**, making him the latest first-round draft pick to join the club.

Kjerstad, an outfielder/first baseman, was the No. 2 overall pick in 2020 out of Arkansas but has been limited by injuries and illness. However, this season he was hitting .349 with 10 home runs and 30 RBI at Triple A Norfolk.

The Orioles promoted 2022 No. 1 overall pick **Jackson Holliday** two weeks ago, and he joined

first-round picks **Colton Cowser** (No. 5 overall in 2021), **Adley Rutschman** (No. 1, 2019) and **Grayson Rodriguez** (No. 11, 2018) on the roster.

• **Rangers:** Texas activated catcher **Jonah Heim** from the bereavement list.

• **White Sox:** Chicago lost 7-0 at Minnesota on Monday night, its eighth shutout loss in 22 games. Chicago fell to 3-19, the worst record in the majors.
