AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DORAL, FLORIDA, APPROVING/DENYING TEXT AMENDMENTS TO THE CITY OF DORAL CODE, TO ADOPT AN ALCOHOL BEVERAGES CODE FOR THE CITY OF DORAL, AND CREATE CHAPTER 34; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER; PROVIDING FOR INCORPORATION INTO THE CODE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

Part I.

Summary of the proposed ordinance and statement of public purpose¹:

The public purpose of this Code Amendment is to codify the City’s Alcohol Code to Chapter 34 from its existing location in Chapter 74 and to clarify hours of closure. Additionally, the Ordinance improves existing security measures currently required by Chapter 74.

- a. Estimate of direct compliance costs that businesses may reasonably incur if the proposed ordinance is enacted:

As proposed, Chapter 34 clarifies hours of sale and improves security measures. Hours of sale for entertainment establishments are reduced from 2:00 a.m. to 1:30 a.m. with a 2:00 a.m. closure. While Entertainment Establishments are required to stop serving at 1:30 a.m. instead of 2:00 a.m., these may apply for the extended hours permit. Impact of security measures for extended hours include off-duty police \$75.44 per hour; cost of wand between \$170.00 to \$200.00.

However, with an extended hours permit, sale would be extended to 3:30 a.m. and the business shall not remain open past 4:00 a.m. Note that the current regulations for Extended Hours Permits require private security personnel.

Good faith estimate of the number of businesses likely to be impacted by the ordinance:

There are approximately nine (9) entertainment establishments within the City limits that would benefit by applying for an Extended Hours Permit. Eight (8) of the nine (9) entertainment establishments currently operating could not previously avail themselves to apply for an Extended Hours Permit for entertainment establishments, as they are not located within the DMU District. One of the nine (9) establishments is located within the DMU, however, they never applied for the requisite extended hours permit.
