A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DORAL, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXTEND THE EXISTING AGREEMENT WITH THERAPEUTIC LIFESTYLE CONCEPTS LLC. FOR THE PROVISION OF TAI-CHI PROGRAMMING FOR A PERIOD OF SIX (6) MONTHS THROUGH SEPTEMBER 2021; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Therapeutic Concepts LLC is a local Doral business who provides Tai-Chi programming virtually and at our park facilities to the senior citizen community. These classes provide the seniors with balance, physical strength, flexibility, and mental relaxation all of which are essential and beneficial functions for this population; and

WHEREAS, Therapeutic Lifestyle Concepts, LLC (our Senior Tai-Chi program) original agreement expired on 8/19/20. Due to the sudden health emergency of the previous provider and the time constraints to not have a long lapse in services to the senior community, Therapeutic Lifestyle Concepts, LLC was contracted for a period of one (1) year to provide services. This was to serve until another Recreation Program solicitation was issued. Staff issued RFP #2020-02 in January of 2020 for Recreational Programming and unfortunately, at that time, no proposals were received for Senior Tai-Chi; and,

WHEREAS, the agreement was approved to be extended as per Resolution No. 20-156, to allow staff to issue a new Recreation Programs Bid. In January of 2021 RFP #2021-01 Recreational Programming (Virtual and On-Site) was advertised. Regrettably, Therapeutics Lifestyle Concepts, LLC was not able to attend the pre-bid meeting and thus was not able to submit a proposal. Additionally, there was no other Tai-Chi providers present in the pre-bid meeting and no new Tai-Chi proposals were received; and,

WHEREAS, The City Manager's Office respectfully requests approval from the Mayor and City Councilmembers to extend the time under the current agreement with Therapeutic Lifestyle Concepts, LLC (Senior Tai-Chi) for a period not to exceed six (6) months. This will ensure there is no lapse in services provided to the community and allow the provider to continue offering virtual programs and resume onsite programming once restrictions are lifted, while another solicitation is advertised; and,

WHEREAS, this does not exceed department budgeted funds from account 001.90005.500340 (Contractual Services). and does not exceed the \$15,000.00 threshold.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DORAL, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Recitals. The above recitals are confirmed, adopted, and incorporated herein and made a part hereof by this reference.

<u>Section 2. Approval & Authorization</u>. The Mayor and City Councilmembers hereby authorize the City Manager to extend the time under the current agreement with Therapeutic Lifestyle Concepts, LLC (Senior Tai-Chi) for a period not to exceed six (6) months through September 2021.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Implementation.</u> The City Manager and the City Attorney are hereby authorized to take such action as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this Resolution.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF DORAL

AND

Therapeutic Lifestyle Concepts, LLC FOR Senior Tai-Chi Programming

THIS AGREEMENT is made between Therapeutic Lifestyle Concepts a Florida limited liability company, (hereinafter the "Provider"), and the CITY OF DORAL, FLORIDA, a Florida municipal corporation, (hereinafter the "City").

WHEREAS, the Provider and City, through mutual negotiation, have agreed upon a scope of services, schedule, and fees for Senior Tai-Chi Programming (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to engage the Provider to perform the services specified below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, the Provider and the City agree as follows.

1. <u>Scope of Services/Deliverables</u>.

- 1.1 The Provider shall furnish professional services to the City as set forth in the Scope of Services (Exhibit A)
- 1.2 The "Scope of Services" includes a Project Schedule for the Project which includes a breakdown of tasks, timeline and deliverables to the City.

2. Term/Commencement Date.

- 2.1 This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by both parties and shall remain in effect through one year after the execution date, unless earlier terminated in accordance with Paragraph 8.
- 2.2 Provider agrees that time is of the essence and Provider shall complete each deliverable for the Project within the timeframes set forth in the Project Schedule, unless extended by the City Manager.

3. Compensation and Payment.

3.1 For the provisions of the Services, Provider shall be entitled to receive the hourly rate submitted as part of Exhibit "A" for the services described Page 1 of 9

- herein. Provider shall not be entitled to any other compensation under this Agreement.
- 3.2 In exchange for the opportunity to provide the Services and other covenants contained herein, the City shall be entitled to one hundred percent 100% of the fees paid by participants (the "City Fee"). The non-resident surcharge is fully payable to the City and shall not be included in the monthly gross income calculation.
- 3.3 The City agrees to collect all fees from participants and set a schedule of fees to be charged to participants.
- 3.4 If a dispute should occur regarding an invoice submitted, the City Manager may withhold payment of the disputed amount and may pay to the Provider the undisputed portion of the invoice. Upon written request of the Finance Director, the Provider shall provide written documentation to justify the invoice. Any compensation disputes shall be decided by the City Manager whose decision shall be final.
- 3.5 It is the responsibility of the Provider to pay all applicable local, state, and federal taxes associated with this Agreement, and to acquire and pay for all necessary permits, licenses, and insurance required for the execution of this Agreement.

4. Subproviders.

- 4.1 The Provider shall be responsible for all payments to any sub-providers and shall maintain responsibility for all work related to the Project.
- 4.2 Any sub-providers used on the Project must have the prior written approval of the City Manager or his designee.

5. <u>City's Responsibilities</u>.

- 5.1 Furnish to Provider, at the Provider's written request, all available maps, plans, existing studies, reports and other data pertinent to the services to be provided by Provider, in possession of the City.
- 5.2 Arrange for access to and make all provisions for Provider to enter upon real property as required for Provider to perform services as may be requested in writing by the Provider (if applicable).

- 5.3 The City will approve any rates, or the manner for setting such rates charged by the Provider.
- 5.4 The City is responsible for any damage or destruction of the Fields, including that caused by Force of Nature except to the extent identified herein.
- 5.5 The City will approve the operating budget for services performed under this Agreement.

6. Provider's Responsibilities.

- 6.1 The Provider shall exercise the same degree of care, skill and diligence in the performance of the Project as is ordinarily provided by a professional under similar circumstances. If at any time during the term of this Agreement or within one year from the completion of the Project, it is determined that the Provider's deliverables are incorrect, defective or fail to conform to the Scope of Services of the Project, upon written notification from the City Manager, the Provider shall at Providers sole expense, immediately correct the work. The City in no way assumes or shares any responsibility or liability of the Provider or Sub Provider under this agreement.
- 6.2 Submit an operating budget for the service that provides for registration fees equal to the costs of operating the service.

7. Conflict of Interest.

7.1 To avoid any conflict of interest or any appearance thereof, Provider shall not, for the term of this Agreement, represent any private sector entities (developers, corporations, real estate investors, etc.), with regard to any City related matter.

8. <u>Termination</u>.

- 8.1 The City Manager without cause may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Provider, or immediately with cause.
- 8.2 Upon receipt of the City's written notice of termination, Provider shall stop work on the Project.
- 8.3 In the event of termination by the City, the Provider shall be paid for all work accepted by the City Manager up to the date of termination, provided that the Provider has first complied with the provisions of Paragraph 8.4.

8.4 The Provider shall transfer all books, records, reports, working drafts, documents, maps, and data pertaining to the Project to the City, in a hard copy and electronic format specified by the City within 14 days from the date of the written notice of termination or the date of expiration of this Agreement.

9. **Insurance**.

- 9.1 The Provider shall secure and maintain throughout the duration of this Agreement insurance of such type and in such amounts as required by Exhibit G. The insurance carrier shall be qualified to do business in the State of Florida and have agents upon whom service of process may be made in the State of Florida.
- 9.2 Certificates of Insurance shall be provided to the City at the time of execution of this Agreement and certified copies provided if requested. Each policy certificate shall be endorsed with a provision that not less than thirty (30) calendar days' written notice shall be provided to the City before any policy or coverage is cancelled or restricted, or in accordance to policy provisions. The City further reserves the right to solicit additional coverage, or require higher limits of liability as needed, and depending on the nature of scope, or level of exposure.

10. Nondiscrimination.

10.1 During the term of this Agreement, Provider shall not discriminate against any of its employees or applicants for employment because of their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin, and to abide by all Federal and State laws regarding nondiscrimination

11. Attorneys' Fees and Waiver of Jury Trial.

- 11.1 In the event of any litigation arising out of this Agreement, each party shall be responsible for their attorneys' fees and costs, including the fees and expenses of any paralegals, law clerks and legal assistants, and including fees and expenses charged for representation at both the trial and appellate levels.
- 11.2 In the event of any litigation arising out of this Agreement, each party hereby knowingly, irrevocably, voluntarily and intentionally waives its right to trial by jury.

12. Indemnification.

- 12.1 Provider shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all demands, claims, losses, suits, liabilities, causes of action, judgment or damages, arising out of, related to, or any way connected with Provider's performance or non-performance of any provision of this Agreement including, but not limited to, liabilities arising from contracts between the Provider and third parties made pursuant to this Agreement. Provider shall reimburse the City for all its expenses including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred in and about the defense of any such claim or investigation and for any judgment or damages arising out of, related to, or in any way connected with Provider's performance or non-performance of this Agreement. This section shall be interpreted and construed in a manner to comply with any applicable Florida Statutes, including without limitation Sections 725.06 and 725.08, Fla. Stat., if applicable.
- 12.2 The provisions of this section shall survive termination of this Agreement.
- 12.3 Ten dollars (\$10) of the payments made by the City constitute separate, distinct, and independent consideration for the granting of this indemnification, the receipt and sufficiency of which is voluntary and knowingly acknowledged by the Provider.

13. Notices/Authorized Representatives.

13.1 Any notices required by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been properly given if transmitted by hand-delivery, by registered or certified mail with postage prepaid return receipt requested, or by a private postal service, addressed to the parties (or their successors) at the following addresses:

14. Governing Law.

14.1 This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Exclusive venue for any litigation arising out of this Agreement shall be in Miami-Dade County, Florida.

15. Entire Agreement/Modification/Amendment.

- 15.1 This writing contains the entire Agreement of the parties and supersedes any prior oral or written representations. No representations were made or relied upon by either party, other than those that are expressly set forth herein.
- 15.2 No agent, employee, or other representative of either party is empowered to modify or amend the terms of this Agreement, unless executed with the same formality as this document.

16. Ownership and Access to Records and Audits.

- 16.1 All records, books, documents, maps, data, deliverables, papers and financial information (the "Records") that result from the Provider providing services to the City under this Agreement shall be the property of the City.
- 16.2 The City Manager or his designee shall, during the term of this Agreement and for a period of three (3) years from the date of termination of this Agreement, have access to and the right to examine and audit any Records of the Provider involving transactions related to this Agreement.
- 16.3 The City may cancel this Agreement for refusal by the Provider to allow access by the City Manager or his designee to any Records pertaining to work performed under this Agreement that are subject to the provisions of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

17. Nonassignability.

17.1 This Agreement shall not be assignable by Provider unless such assignment is first approved by the City Manager. The City is relying upon the apparent Page 6 of 9

qualifications and personal expertise of the Provider, and such firm's familiarity with the City's area, circumstances and desires.

18. Severability.

18.1 If any term or provision of this Agreement shall to any extent be held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and each remaining term and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and be enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law, provided the severance of any term does not result in interest on any Bonds issued to finance the Fields being includable in gross income for federal tax purposes.

19. Independent Contractor.

- 19.1 The Provider and its employees, volunteers and agents shall be and remain independent contractors and not agents or employees of the City with respect to all of the acts and services performed by and under the terms of this Agreement. This Agreement shall not in any way be construed to create a partnership, association or any other kind of joint undertaking, enterprise or venture between the parties.
- 19.2 The Provider agrees that it will not take any Federal tax position inconsistent with it being a service provider.

20. Compliance with Laws.

20.1 The Provider shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and lawful orders of public authorities relating to the Service.

21. Waiver

21.1 The failure of either party to this Agreement to object to or to take affirmative action with respect to any conduct of the other which is in violation of the terms of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of the violation or breach, or of any future violation, breach or wrongful conduct.

22. Survival of Provisions

22.1 Any terms or conditions of either this Agreement that require acts beyond the date of the term of the Agreement, shall survive termination of the Agreement, shall remain in full force and effect unless and until the terms or conditions are completed and shall be fully enforceable by either party.

23. Prohibition of Contingency Fees.

23.1 The Provider warrants that it has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Provider, to solicit or secure this Agreement, and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any person(s), company, corporation, individual or firm, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Provider, any fee, commission, percentage, gift, or any other consideration, contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Agreement.

24. Counterparts

24.1 This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and such counterpart shall constitute one and the same instrument.

25. Removal of Unsatisfactory Personnel

25.1 The City may make written request to Provider for the prompt removal and replacement of any personnel employed or retained by Provider or any sub provider. The Provider shall respond to the City within fourteen calendar days of receipt of such request with either the removal and replacement of such personnel or with written justification as to why removal is not warranted. All decisions involving personnel will be made by Provider. Such request shall solely relate to said employees work under this agreement. In the event the City Manager disagrees with the justification offered by Provider, the City Manager's decision to replace the employee shall be final.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties execute this Agreement on the respective dates under each signature: The City, signing by and through its City Manager, attested to by its City Clerk, duly authorized to execute same and by Provider by and through its **Owner**, whose representative has been duly authorized to execute same.

WHEREAS, Therapeutic Concepts LLC is a local Doral business who provides Tai-Chi programming virtually and at our park facilities to the senior citizen community. whereas, Due to COVID-19 restrictions, all community centers and onsite programming at city park facilities has been suspended since March 2020. Therefore, the classes are held virtually three (3) times a week and are free for the participants, whom are predominantly Doral residents and Silver Club members; and

WHEREAS, the current agreement with Therapeutic Concepts LLC is set to expire August 18, 2020 and a bid has not been able to be issued due to the uncertainty of COVID-19 as it relates to programming and park activities; and

WHEREAS, Staff respectfully requests approval from the Mayor and City Council-members due to occurrences beyond the control of the parties caused by the COVID-19 pandemic to extend the existing agreements with Therapeutic Concepts LLC for the provision of providing Tai-Chi classes for the City of Doral Parks and Recreation Department for a period of six (6) months through February 2020.
